For 40 years, Luisah Teish has taught African Diasporic Spirituality and Spiritual Activism through her books, conference keynotes, workshops and her personal community, Ile Orunmila Oshun.

We are raising funds to acquire a property that will serve as a home for Yeye and The School of Ancient Mysteries. The layout will include a retreat center, and will be sanctuary for organizers, artists, elders, and spiritual seekers from all walks of life. Our esteemed faculty will immerse students in the spiritual practices of the world's ancient mysteries, with a special focus on the rich traditions of the African diaspora.

In the School of Ancient Mysteries, practitioners will become empowered, learning eco-mythology, stories of the earth; attend to a garden of herbal medicine, and learn the proper usage of these healing plants. The Center will provide retreats for writers and artists, including space for gathering, performances, and art installations.

The Ritual Arts Department will teach filmmaking, arts and spiritual disciplines including costume design, and Indigenous body adornment. Special emphasis is placed on drumming and the sacred dances for the Ancestors, the Orishas, the Loas, and the Spirits of the Earth.

The knowledge practioners acquire and the works they produce will be tailored to address vital issues of social justice, environmental restoration, and community healing.

Practitioners will learn to use their spiritual power to organize our communities, to address police brutality, and to clean the waters of the world. We aspire to create a place of learning and healing that will become a global institute dedicated to creating a healed world. Our curiculum will address repair on an environmental, social, cultural and spiritual level. The legacy of our work will ripple forward for seven generations (210 years).
